ABOUT THE MUSEUM

The historic legacy of early aviation on Alameda's West End and Naval Air Station Alameda is preserved at the Alameda Naval Air Museum located in the former Air Terminal Building at Alameda Point. The museum features archival materials, photographs, exhibits and stories ranging from the first Transpacific flight—from the West Coast to the Philippines—by Pan America Airways' China Clipper in 1935, to the military units and civilian workers of World War II, up to the eventual closing of the base in 1997.



The original museum was founded by Marilyn York and Barbara Baack prior to base closure. Their determination combined with a grant for building upgrades enabled ANAM to re-open its doors in 2004.

Thanks to a dedicated team of volunteers and museum members, Alameda Naval Air Museum has become an educational community center to tell the story of early Pacific aviation and base beginnings in support of the Pacific Fleet in World War II and its subsequent decades of service to the nation during Korea, Vietnam and Desert Storm. Presidents Kennedy, Bush and Clinton all stopped here. Actor Robert Stack was stationed at NAS Alameda with his air squadron.



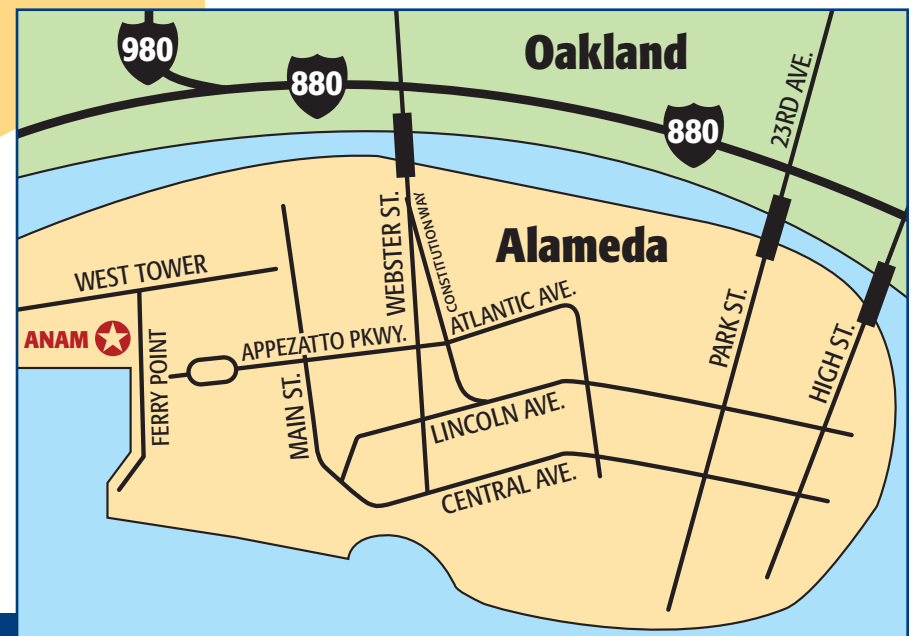
